- \*If you need to communicate a special need (such as gas, coffee, pit stop, etc.) call the lead car.
- \*If the car behind or in front of you pulls over, do the same when it is safe to do so.
- \*Always keep enough room between cars so the cars that are not in the group can pass easily.
